There are advantages to knowing how to distribute your assets.
The tax consequences are worth considering.

Take care of your retirement plan assets

If you plan to make a gift to The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center and provide for loved ones through your estate, consider naming us the beneficiary of your retirement plan and designating other assets to heirs. The reason: Some assets are more tax-friendly for your heirs than others.

EXAMPLE: Lynn wants to make a legacy gift of \$100,000 and leave the rest of her estate to her son, George. Her estate includes appreciated stock and retirement assets. There is a distinct advantage to naming MD Anderson as an IRA beneficiary and leaving the stock to her son. We receive IRA funds tax-free, and the full amount supports our work, but IRA funds George receives are subject to income tax when distributed to him. With stock, George pays tax only on the amount the stock appreciates after inheritance.
